THUNDERBIRDS CHARITIES DONATES \$2.5 MILLION TO VALLEY CHARITIES DURING SPRING FUNDING CYCLE

PHOENIX, Ariz. – Thunderbirds Charities, the charitable giving arm of The Thunderbirds – hosts of the Waste Management Phoenix Open – awarded more than \$2.5 million in grants to 58 Valley charities during its 2021 spring funding cycle. Thunderbirds Charities awarded grants of \$150,000 or more to four Valley Charities that included \$250,000 to Phoenix Public Library Foundation, \$200,000 to Teen Lifeline, \$200,000 to Human Services Campus, and \$150,000 to Homeward Bound.

With the spring funding cycle in the books, Thunderbirds Charities has now opened its 2021 fall funding cycle. Information about the fall funding cycle can be found at www.ThunderbirdsCharities.org.

"Many charities and nonprofit organizations are still reeling from the effects of the pandemic," said Scott Jenkins, President of Thunderbirds Charities. "Obviously, we take tremendous pride in providing these grants to deserving organizations who help so many in our communities — especially during times of great difficulty and incredible challenges. Supporting our charity partners is, without a doubt, the most gratifying part of being a Thunderbird, and together, we look forward to a strong rebound which will help us get back to giving back."

The \$250,000 grant from Thunderbirds Charities will support Phoenix Public Library Foundation's Children's Place at the Burton Barr Central Library – a 10,000 square-foot, children-oriented learning space located on the first floor of Phoenix's downtown central library.

With the grant of \$200,000, Human Services Campus will be able to support their critical client services which helps remove barriers for individuals experiencing homelessness and lead to permanent housing.

Thunderbirds Charities' grant of \$200,000 will support Teen Lifeline's Teen Crisis Hotline/Textline which trains teens to talk to other teens about their problems, giving teens in crisis a free and safe place to connect with someone they can relate to.

Another grant of \$150,000 will go to Homeward Bound to create pathways out of poverty for homeless families in the Valley, keeping families together and creating communities where every family has a home.
